# Healthy San Francisco

Halfway there: 32,600 enrolled

Provider network expanded in September 2008

- Additional primary care medical home
- Independent private physician's group
- 4 additional non-profit hospitals

Expect to be near 60,000 in December 2009

Connecticut, Philadelphia both exploring the program

Howard County, Maryland – program modeled on SF

# The New SF General Hospital

## Proposition A

- Approved by voters, November 2008
- \$887.4 million general obligation bond
- First bond sale, early 2009
- Initial site work in 2009
- Construction begins 2010
- Completion scheduled for 2015

# SF General Hospital

- Over 1,500 people cared for each day
- 15,000 ambulances/yr.
- 85% of patients are uninsured or are publicly insured (Medi-Cal or Medicare).
- The region's only Trauma Center (Level I)
- 20% of total hospital beds in the city; but provides over 50% of the psychiatric, HIV, and substance abuse care citywide.

## St. Luke's

Blue Ribbon Panel - 3 month process with hospital staff, health care experts, business leaders, labor leaders, religious leaders, community leaders, patient and neighborhood advocates.

Based on recommendations, the Board of California Pacific Medical Center has voted to rebuild St. Luke's on the existing campus.




# Seniors as percent of total population (2000 Census)



## Percentage of Senior Population (65+) with Income below Poverty




# Proportion of Senior Households (60+) Living Alone

# The Community Living Fund

- CLF's mission is to support San Francisco residents to stay in the community and to avoid institutionalization.
- The program uses flexible funds to provide goods and services, and case management.
- The program has served 457 clients since its inception in March 2007, and is exceeding its goals of keeping adults with disabilities and frail seniors in the community.

Performance Measure	Target	Actual
Percentage of formerly institutionalized CLF clients who have successfully continued community living for a period of at least six months.	70%	73%
Percentage of CLF clients who were previously at imminent risk of institutionalization who have successfully continued community living for a period of at least six months.	70%	76%

# California Institute for Regenerative Medicine

- Largest funder of human embryonic stem cell research
- 26 California institutions awarded grants, including UCSF, The Gladstone Institutes, UC Berkeley and Stanford
- \$614,314,346 in total grants awarded to date

## 2007-2011:

- \$99.1M tax revenue to California
- 2,745 Annual Jobs Created

# Leveraging California's Money


- **MOUs in place with:**

# Shape Up SF

- **Walking Challenge: 2,000 participants, 165,000 miles**
- **Shape Up @ Work: City Employees log 1,368,049 minutes of physical activity over 10 weeks, averaging 30 minutes/day**
- **Sunday Streets: 4.5 miles, thousands of visitors**
- **Free Summer Lunch: 5,200 nutritious meals/day**
- **Soda-Free Summer: 20,000 youth participate**
- **Edible schoolyards**
- **Salad bars in 25 schools**
- **15 Wellness Centers in Public Schools**

# Sunday Streets

“Reimagining our Streets”

- Successfully closed 5 mile route from Bayview to Chinatown to vehicular traffic



## **Sick Leave Ordinance**

- **First in the country in 2006**
- **At the time, 115,000 did not have paid sick leave**
- **Covers all employees, including part-time and temporary workers**
- **Model for other cities and states**

# Drugstore Tobacco Ban

Tobacco related disease:

- Leading cause of preventable death
- CA Health care costs:  
\$475 per resident  
\$15.8 billion statewide



# Medi-Cal Lawsuit

- **Challenged the State on Medi-Cal rate cuts**
- **Proposed statewide cut of \$1.1 billion**
- **\$5.8 million SF impact**
- **123,000 SF residents rely on Medi-Cal**
- **Five California counties and the Alliance for Patient Care joined**
- **Court ruling will now require the State to restore most of these cuts in March 2009**

- **Partnered with Families USA for first survey of cities and impact of lack of health care access in cities nationwide**
- **Obesity prevention work at US Conference of Mayors**
- **Seeking moratorium on Medicaid formula changes**
- **SCHIP reauthorization**
